


SEASONAL PRINTS PIE SERVER

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects



MATERIALS

CCX508 Pie Server
Fan Brush
Liner Brush
Yellow Sponge Quarter
Pencil or Water-Based Marker
Writing Bottle

COLORS

CMM 18- Pumpkin Pie
CMM 13 - Cinnamon Stick
CMM 69 - Orange Juice
CMM 30 - Red Rocks
CMM 31 - Licorice



INSTRUCTIONS

This piece can be made with any combination of colors or number of prints. Below are the instructions for how this exact piece was made, but make it your own to fit your needs!

- 1. Thin down some Carrot Juice paint with 50% water to 50% paint. Use a fan brush to apply one coat of watered-down paint to the inside of the dish.
- 2. Dip the sponge into Cinnamon Stick paint. Tap the excess paint onto a paper towel. Tap the sponge around the rim to make the "crust". Repeat for 3 coats.
- 3. When the paint is dry, use a pencil or a water-based marker to sketch on the lines dividing the pie. First we are going to create 4 sections.
- One line down the center (from top to bottom)
- One line across the middle (from side to side)
- 4. Now we need to make two lines that divide each of those sections in half. Turn the plate a quarter turn so that the lines now look like an "x":
- One line down the center (from top to bottom)
- One line across the middle (from side to side)
- 5. Apply a generous layer of Pumpkin Pie to the foot. Place the foot as far into the point of one of the sections as it will fit, and press firmly.
- 6. Repeat step 5, using the same foot, for each section.
- 7. Thin down some Red Rocks paint using 50% water to 50% paint. Load up a liner brush and pull it along the lines that are dividing the plate.
- 8. Sketch the name and the sentiment with a pencil or a water-based marker.
- 9. For the words "Sweeter" and "Pie", use either a liner brush or a writer bottle to paint it with Red Rocks paint.
- 10. Use the writer bottle with Licorice to paint the word "than".
- 11. Paint the name with a writer bottle of Red Rocks paint.
- 12. Finally, flip the server over and sponge 3 coats of Cinnamon Sticks to the sides and back.

TIPS

- When sketching in pencil for the writing, gently rub back and forth over the pencil lines to remove excess graphite. This will make it easier to write on top of it.
- For the writing bottle, only fill the bottle 1/2 way to avoid it coming out too fast. This will help with smaller writing.
- Get the writer bottle flowing on a paper towel before you write on your piece. This will work out any air and sputtering that might occur.
- These samples don't have a year painted on them, we suggest putting the year somewhere on the plate.
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
